



Burrard Terminal Truck Traffic



The Suncor Burrard Products Terminal is situated on 430 acres of land of which 175 acres are used for terminal operations.

- The Upper Terminal, located in Port Moody, contains the fuel processing units, main tank farm and the fuel blending facilities.
- The Middle Terminal is located on the south side of the Barnet Highway in Burnaby. It contains the secondary tank farm and truck facilities.
- The Lower Terminal is located in Burnaby, Port Moody and along the Burrard Inlet. It contains the marine and rail facilities.

Gasoline, diesel, jet fuel, ethanol, and bio-diesel arrive at the terminal via pipeline, marine tankers, trucks and rail.

In preparation for the final stage of construction at the Burrard terminal, which when in operation later this year will increase rail offloading of diesel, there will be an increase in truck traffic for approximately two months.

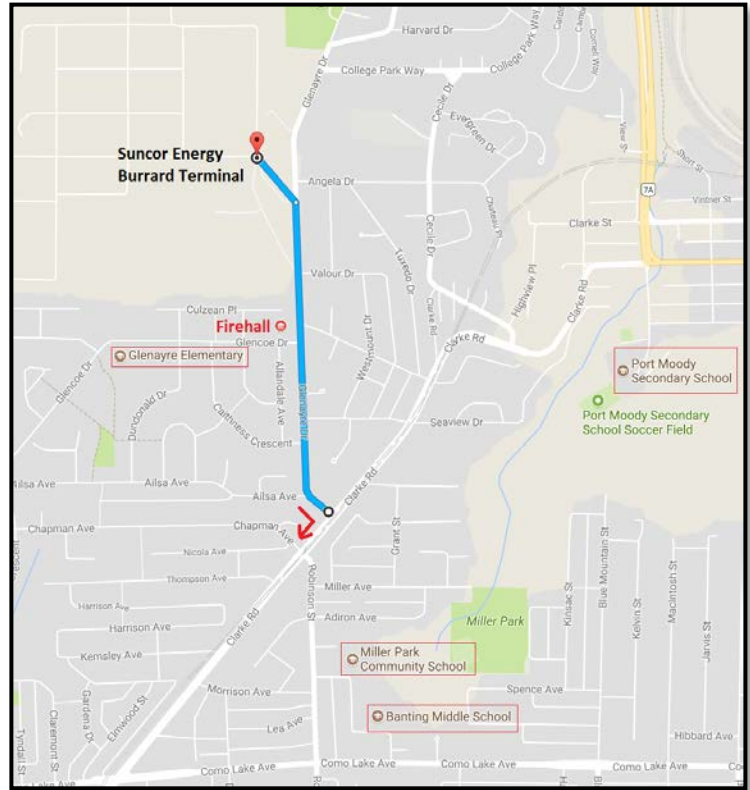
The project continues to focus on minimizing environmental impact and reducing noise as much as possible in consideration of our neighbours.

Truck route

Trucks will arrive and leave from the shortest possible route in the community. They will leave from the Upper Terminal construction entrance off Glenayre Drive and travel south to Clarke Road. The trucks will then turn right onto Clarke Road to join existing municipal truck routes as specified by the City of Coquitlam.

Timing of truck traffic for 2020:

Truck Route	Schedule	Frequency

Concerns and mitigation

We understand that the truck traffic might be a concern to the local community.

Truck operators are to strictly adhere to municipal trucking routes while accessing and egressing the terminal and surrounding residential area.

Speed limits are to be strictly adhered to and the use of horns (unless in an emergency) is prohibited.

Trucks with trailers may be used to minimize the total number of trucks required.

At Suncor, we value the relationship we have with our neighbors and will work to minimize the impact of this activity. We will ensure that the transportation of this material is done in a safe and efficient manner.

Truck route

Trucks will travel from the Upper Terminal construction entrance off Glenayre Drive and travel south to Clarke Road. Trucks will then turn right onto Clarke Road to join existing municipal truck routes as specified by the City of Coquitlam.
