

## Montreal Sulphur Plant's community liaison committee



The Suncor sulphur recovery plant is located on Cherrier Street in Montreal East, Quebec, Canada. This facility, which started production in 1958, has operated under several names over the year including Laurentide Chemicals & Sulphur Ltd, Sulconam, Marsulex, Chemtrade, and, since 2014, Suncor.

This plant established its own community liaison committee in 1995. Committee's mission is to maintain a communication network between the plant and members of its neighboring community who have an interest in harmonizing industrial activities with the environment. Topics include plant operations, environmental issues, and the very slight risk of a major industrial accident. Committee members participate in the testing of the plant's emergency siren.

Air pollutants of concern to members of the committee include sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) and hydrogen sulphide (H<sub>2</sub>S) and greenhouse gas (CO<sub>2</sub>) emissions. Environmental emission is reviewed with the members of the committee on a regular basis.
